Course Title: Catechesis 8: The Communion of the Faithful

Course Description:

This year we will delve into the mystery of the Church by studying her nature, mission, and history. Furthermore, we will deepen our understanding of what it means for us to live as members of the Church through our study of Catholic moral and social teaching. *The ultimate goal of this course is not to memorize "facts" about the church or to be able to recite a list of the Church's teachings; rather, our goal is that, by increasing our knowledge and understanding of the Church, her history, and her teachings, we might embrace more fully our relationship with God as members of His Church.*

Course Objectives:

1. Recognize our fundamental identity as children of God and our call to be in relationship with Him through the Church
2. Understand the nature and mission of the Church and see how she has lived out this mission throughout the changing circumstances of history.
3. Gain a basic understanding of the nature of morality and the Church's moral teaching.
4. Recognize our obligations as Christian citizens
5. Deepen our understanding of our human nature, by reflecting on what it means to be created in the image of God as male and female.
6. Grow closer to God by allowing what we learn to take root in our hearts!
