Course Title: Sacred Scripture–New Covenant

Course Description:

“God who creates and conserves all things by his Word, provides constant evidence of himself in created realities. Furthermore, wishing to open up the way to heavenly salvation he manifested himself to our first parents from the very beginning” (*Dei Verbum*, paragraph 3). In this course we will follow the thread of salvation history, the greatest story ever told. It is the greatest story not only because it is loaded with adventures, battles, and victory over impossible odds; kings, seers, warriors, and heroes; gripping narrative, poetry, romance, and scandal; but also because it is, in a very real way, our own story as children of God, and if children, then heirs of God himself (Romans 8:16-17). There is no story more deserving of study than that of salvation history culminating and reaching its perfection in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We study this sacred text to come to know this person who is the Word; “Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ” (St. Jerome). This course is the sequel to the course Sacred Scripture–Old Covenant, and will study the New Testament of the Bible.

Course Objectives:

1. Follow the narrative thread of Jesus and the Apostles
2. Study the doctrine presented in the New Testament
3. Become familiar with the senses of Scripture
4. Be familiar with the principles of exegesis

Course Texts:

- The Holy Bible (acceptable translations include the New American Bible, The Revised Standard Version Catholic Edition, Douay Rheims, and the Vulgate).
- *Dei Verbum: Dogmatic Constitution On Divine Revelation*, Vatican II.

Course Supplies:

- Bible of an approved translation
- Paper
- Pen
- Pencil

Grading:

- Class Participation: 10%
- Homework: 35%
- Tests: 35%*
- Exam: 20%

Scope and Sequence:

This course will finish the narrative begun in the Old Covenant class, then move into the epistles to study the teachings therein. The following list comprises a sketch of this year's curriculum:

Class Participation:

Class participation will be graded according to four tasks that can and should be done each class. 1) Be on time to class, 2) Bring all appropriate materials for class, 3) Have your homework (even if you didn't finish, have it out and that will count), 4) Be attentive in class, and make it a personal goal to say at least one thing each class (even if it's just a question about what page we're on, or asking someone to repeat themselves).

Homework:

Homework will consist of keeping up with the reading assignments (average 2 chapters a night), and completing an ongoing log summarizing the chapters read.

Late/Make-up Work:

If you are absent when an assignment is handed in, then you have as many school days as you were absent to turn in the work for full credit. Work will be considered late after those days have expired. Late work will receive a grade no greater than 80% unless I'm in a bad mood, then good luck getting any credit at all.

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No homework or test grade is necessarily final until the semester ends. Students have the standing option to make corrections on homework OR tests to improve their grade.
